## More Students than Ever before are Graduating from the Canton Public School District



In 2005 the Canton Public School district's graduation rate was 29.7 percent. Its dropout rate was 59.8 percent. In 2006, when Dwight Luckett, Sr., became the Superintendent of the Canton Public School District, he faced a difficult task of lowering the district's dropout rate from 42.7% and raising its graduation rate from 41.8 percent. Under Luckett's leadership, the rate has increased. Today the district's graduation rate has improved to 72.2 percent. That's an increase of 40% more of its students graduating from school. The district's dropout rate has been tremendously decreased to 17.8 percent. That's 40% more students choosing to stay in school. Over the last six years, approximately 450 more students have earned their high school diploma.

This accomplishment comes after several years of constantly communicating the district's vision, restructuring the leadership team, and refocusing the district by raising expectations. This district-wide effort by administrators and teachers coupled with better parental involvement, not only encourages students to graduate but go on to college to pursue higher degrees. As a result, in recent years, the district has observed some of its largest graduating classes in its history.

The Canton Public School District continues to work hard to overcome years of challenges to increase student achievement. Over the last several years it has made undeniable, continuous progress. As a result, last year the Mississippi Department of Education rated **three** of the district's four rated schools "Successful". School leaders say while they have made some incredible gains, they are aware the district has not reached its full potential; however, they are not discouraged. "Our district is still making progress. To move from having schools in a "school improvement status" and only one successful school to having 3 successful schools, shows that we are clearly making progress as a district. Certainly to go from having a 29.7 percent graduation rate to a 72.2% graduation rate is undeniable progress. We are definitely encouraged by our progress, says Superintendent Dwight Luckett, Sr.

Overall our test scores have improved every year. Compared to other schools who match our demographics, we have certainly made tremendous progress. The district is analyzing data and has devised a plan of action to strengthen areas of weakness. It is committed to providing quality personnel and other resources needed to improve students' academic performance. While the district still faces many challenges, there has been steady progress. School leaders say those improvements are having a positive impact on academic achievement as school administrators and teachers work to move all of the district's schools to successful performing and above. As the district continues to intensify its efforts to meet the challenges of more rigorous state requirements, it is encouraged to stay the course until more of its students graduate and go on to pursue higher degrees.




